Florida State University's Center for Global Engagement (CGE) welcomed over 150 new international students from 26 countries to campus this spring. These new arrivals contribute to FSU's global footprint, which now includes over 1,700 international students coming from approximately 120 countries and areas.

"We are excited to have so many international students join us this semester given all of the obstacles they had to go through in order to arrive," said Cindy Green, Director of the CGE. "We look forward to having them involved on campus and adding to the rich cultural diversity of the FSU community."

Nine of the new arrivals are international exchange students from FSU's Global Exchange partner universities in the Netherlands, South Korea, Sweden, France, Spain, Germany, and Japan. They join fourteen other exchange students who are completing the academic year at FSU, for a total of 23 Global Exchange students on campus this semester.

International Coffee Hour Will Resume Friday, January 28



Interested in Participating in an Exchange?

FSU Global Exchanges offers students the unique opportunity to study at one of FSU's 45+ prestigious, international partner universities for either one semester or an academic year.

Participating in a Global Exchange presents students with the opportunity to fulfill academic requirements while taking classes in English at one of FSU's international partner universities. Students will fully immerse themselves in a new culture while forging life-long friendships with fellow international and exchange students.

Students pay FSU tuition and fees and can use financial aid in support of these programs. Tuition and fees are waived at the host university, with all academic credit earned at the host institution transferred back to meet FSU degree requirements.

This semester there are a total of 22 outbound exchange students studying with universities in the following countries: Netherlands, South Korea, France, Spain, Germany, Italy, Martinique, the United Kingdom, and Japan.

Global Citizenship Certificate Scholarship Winners

The Center for Global Engagement would like to recognize and congratulate our Spring 2022 Global Citizenship Certificate Scholarship recipients, Gabriela Gavranic dos Reis, Sara Young, and Jonathon Dorsey.

These three undergraduate students are enrolled in the Global Citizenship Certificate program and are participating in a Global Exchange as their sustained experience. Each will receive a \$1,000 scholarship for the Spring 2022 semester. The students are participating in Global Exchanges with our partner institutions in three different countries.

Dos Reis is currently participating in an exchange program at the University of Strasbourg, France. Young is enrolled virtually at Waseda University, Japan, since student visas to study in Japan are not being issued for spring semester. Dorsey is completing an exchange at Sookmyung Women's University, South Korea.

The Global Citizenship Certificate Scholarship was established in 2017, and is awarded to recognize high achieving students with documented financial need who demonstrate values of global citizenship. FSU undergraduate students who are enrolled in the Global Citizenship Certificate program and are participating in a Global Exchange are eligible to apply for the scholarships.

English Conversation Club is free for FSU students, scholars, and their family members.



CGE Student Spotlight

Erin King, Global Citizenship Certificate (GCC) and FSU alumna with a bachelor's in International Affairs, now works in human resources for Mitsubishi and claims the program shaped her career trajectory.

Growing up in a multi-cultural home, King enrolled in GCC to learn more about cultural differences, both for her own personal and professional understanding.

From a relational standpoint, being involved with GCC helped her bridge the gap between understanding people and their cultures. King believes that participating in the GCC Program honed her communication skills. "I am better able to thrive and interact with my co-workers thanks to the lessons I learned," she said.



Students take a total of four academic courses: one required course and three electives from a list of 500+ liberal studies courses that enhance understanding of global issues and cultures; attend eight intercultural events; and complete one sustained experience.

While taking the required Global Perspectives course, King made connections between her life and global competencies. "We have all experienced those 'ah-ha' moments, when something just clicks and makes perfect sense in your head," King said. "That's how my experience in those courses felt. The class teaches a way of thinking, a mindset when you engage with other cultures. It's something that you feel like everyone should know, but it isn't really made clear until you're given the opportunity to openly and freely discuss it within the course."

King studied abroad in Leysin, Switzerland, counting as her sustained experience.

Undergraduate students interested in learning more about global issues and demonstrating to employers and graduate schools that they're ready to succeed in a diverse and multicultural word should enroll in the Global Citizenship Certificate.

After completing all GCC requirements, King recognized the importance of diversity and inclusion within the work force. She then shifted her interest to human resources and has been working as a recruiter for Mitsubishi, a globally integrated business enterprise which employs millions of individuals across the globe. "GCC pushed me to find a company that focused on the care and

understanding of its employees and that sought out to diversify the workplace," King said. "I now have the great opportunity to speak with a variety of people across the country."
