INFECTIOUS DISEASE TO GLOBAL PANDEMIC

The Evolution & Spread of COVID-19

Join us Monday, September 28, at 5 p.m. on Zoom to hear from Dr. Alan Rowan, public health expert and faculty at FSU's Public Health Program, about the evolution and spread of COVID-19.

Dr. Rowan will walk audiences through the evolution of a virus from an infectious disease to a global pandemic, focusing on the contact tracing efforts for COVID-19

at regional and global levels. He will also use past and current pandemics to provide lessons for identifying and intercepting future ones.

According to Dr. Tanu Kohli Bagwe, who coordinates the Center for Global Engagement's Engage Your World: Intercultural Dialogue Series, inviting Dr. Rowan seemed like the obvious choice to kick off this year's theme of global health and social justice.

"We have a public health expert among us who really understands how pandemic responses work at the ground level," Dr. Kohli Bagwe said. "His work is informed by both theory and practice and he has substantial experience as an epidemiologist in this region. The objective of Engage Your World is to bridge global and local issues, and Dr. Rowan's work in infectious diseases exemplifies that very well."


Dr. Rowan has over 25 years of experience and has worked extensively in the area of infectious and chronic diseases such as the 2003 SARS pandemic. As an epidemiologist in the northwest Florida counties, Dr. Rowan helped create the Florida Epidemic Intelligence Service as well as the Aquatic Toxins program. He was also the Director for the Division of Health Access and Tobacco.


New International Students Join FSU from Around the World



New international student Seif Eldeen
Aldahiyat from Jordan was one of 352 new international students from 70 countries beginning their studies this fall with FSU.
Aldahiyat said one of the main reasons he chose FSU was the amazing reputation FSU has nationwide. Due to the global pandemic, only 29 new students received visas to enter the U.S., 47 FSU graduates started new degree programs, 105 students transferred to FSU from other U.S. institutions. An additional 171 of the newly admitted international students for fall began their studies from their home countries.
