Application Deadline: Sunday, October 10

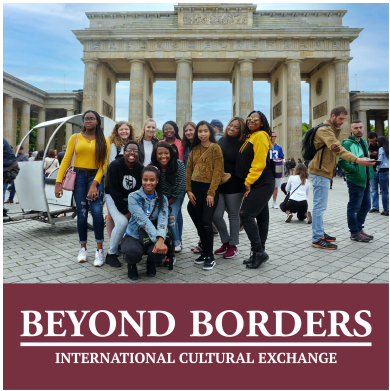

CGE Staff Highlight



Dr. Tanu Kohli Bagwe joined the CGE's staff in 2017. She is an award-winning faculty member and higher education professional. She earned her Ph.D. and M.S. in Global Affairs from Rutgers, The State University of New Jersey.

Currently serving as Acting Program Director and Teaching Faculty for the Global Citizenship Certificate (GCC), she guides undergraduate students both inside and outside of the classroom as they develop intercultural skills and a deeper knowledge of global issues.

Over the past 10 years she has specialized in teaching globally focused, interdisciplinary courses on globalization, international development, global migration, and intercultural communication. Her experience in public, R-1 institutions has given her the ability to leverage low-cost, yet effective, strategies of active-learning, flipped classrooms, hybrid, and online learning for undergraduate classes.

In 2020, Dr. Kohli Bagwe won the Ralph Stair Prize for Innovative Education along with Dr. Elçin Haskollar, GCC Program Director. This prestigious award is given to faculty who develop "innovative education approaches that demonstrate the potential of having great impact nationally and internationally." Dr. Haskollar and Dr. Kohli Bagwe set up a very successful Collaborative Online International Learning (COIL) project by partnering with faculty members at Faculdade de Tecnologia de São Paulo, a Brazilian University, so students from their classes could interact with one another and develop deeper intercultural competencies and expand their worldview.

Dr. Kohli Bagwe has received multiple honors and grants during her time at FSU, including the Undergraduate Teaching Award (2020) for overall teaching, Student Mentor Award (2020) for research mentorship, and the Teaching Advancement Grant (2017) for course innovations. Dr. Kohli Bagwe further specializes in diversity and inclusion and effective teaching strategies for the professional development of graduate students, faculty, and staff.
