A New South Asian Workforce Enters American Journalism

Due to the university's closure on Thursday, February 6, at 3 p.m., the keynote

presentation for the <u>South Asian Media and Cultural Studies Conference</u> has been rescheduled for **Friday, February 7, at 3:30 p.m. in The Globe Auditorium**. A reception with refreshments will be held from 3 to 3:30 p.m.

Dr. Radhika Parameswaran will talk about the steadily rising voices of the Indian immigrant community in American journalism. Indian media professionals, while a small minority of the population, contribute significantly to U.S. journalism at creative and managerial levels. Their presence in American journalism allows this immigrant community to stitch itself more securely into the narrative fabric of the nation, thus contesting the enduring stereotype of South Asians as "perpetual foreigners."

Dr. Parameswaran is the Herman B. Wells Endowed Professor at the Media School, Indiana University. She is the author of *Countering Colorism: Contestations and Critiques in India's Transnational Media Field* that focuses on mainstream and alternative media representations of skin color discrimination in India and the Indian diaspora.

Her talk is the keynote of the 6th Annual <u>South Asian Media and Cultural Studies</u> <u>Conference</u> and is co-sponsored by the College of Social Sciences and Public Policy's Broad International Lecture Series and the Center for Global Engagement's Engage Your World Intercultural Dialogue Series.
