Attend a Webinar with Renowned Environmentalist Marina Silva

Marina Silva – Former Minister of the Environment, Brazil and three-time presidential candidate – will discuss the challenges we need to face in order to preserve the Amazon and its indigenous population on Wednesday, March 17, at 6:30 p.m.

Her reflections are the result of more than 30 years of socio-environmental activism in Brazil. Her talk will examine conservation in the context of the multiple crises that Brazil and the world are currently experiencing.

Silva is an environmentalist, teacher, and politician. Silva competed as a candidate for the Brazilian Presidency in 2010, 2014, and 2018 after serving as Brazil's Minister of the Environment from 2003 to 2008. As a politician, she was elected as the youngest federal senator in 1994 and founded her own Sustainability Network Party in 2013.

Silva has gained worldwide recognition for defending the environment, traditional communities, social justice, and sustainable development. She is the recipient of multiple awards including the Goldman Environmental Prize, WWF Duke of Edinburgh Medal, and the U.N. Champions of the Earth Award. Her work has been covered in the New York Times, the Financial Times, Foreign Policy's Top Global Thinkers, the Guardian, and Harvard Law's Women Inspiring Change Series.

This webinar is presented by The College of Social Science & Public Policy's Broad International Lecture Series, The Center for Global Engagement's Engage Your World Intercultural Dialogue Series, Department of Geography, International Affairs Program, Department of Modern Languages & Linguistics, & Amazônia Latitude.

The talk, which is free and open to the public, will be followed by a question-and-answer session with the speaker. The event also counts as an educational intercultural event toward the <u>Global Citizenship Certificate</u>.

Herrera completed her bachelor's degree at FSU with a double major in geography and environment & society in Summer 2018. Because of her dedication, she not only graduated Magna Cum Laude but also first in her class in environment & society.



Herrera decided to attend FSU like her grandfather who graduated from FSU in the 50's while supporting a family of seven. "Growing up I saw my abuelito and FSU as symbols of hard work and perseverance. I chose FSU because I wanted to feel closer to him and hopefully, to follow his footsteps in making significant change in my community."


As a Climate Change Negotiator, Herrera acts as the Head of Delegation Alternate and intervenes at official United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) events like the Climate Dialogues and The Way Forward. Her work focuses on building resilience to climate change risks in the Republic of Panama.

Herrera's research interests are vulnerability, environmental justice, and climate change adaptation. "My current goal is to negotiate for the Republic of Panama at the UNFCCC Conference of the Parties (COP26) in Glasglow, United Kingdom. My master's is preparing me for this goal by equipping me with conflict resolution tools and a deep understanding of International Relations Theory."
