A Message from the CGE Staff

We are very happy to confirm that the U.S. Department of Homeland Security agreed to rescind the recent ICE/SEVP guidance that required continuing F-1 students to enroll in at least one class with in-person requirements for fall semester. As you know, FSU has been working tirelessly in the last few days to make sure that the university could offer a schedule meeting these requirements to all of our F-1 students.

This action means that we revert back to the March SEVP guidance that allowed F-1 students to remain in the U.S. while taking a fully remote course load. That allowance won't change. We will share any additional details about this as soon as we have them.

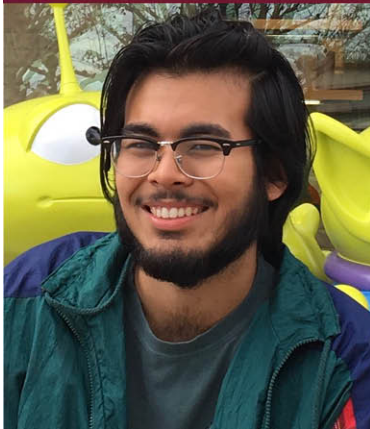
We are extremely pleased with the successful advocacy on behalf of international students shown across the U.S. It came not only from the lawsuits from MIT, Harvard, and other universities, but also from efforts of professional associations,

advocacy groups, and individuals who spoke out to their Members of Congress.

Continuing students no longer need to worry about having one in-person class for fall semester and can make scheduling decisions based on what is best for their health and safety.
